PASADENA QUARTERBACKS CLUB BEGINNING FALL 2025**

*The iconic club will evolve in its 80<sup>th</sup> year and be re-branded as the 'Rose Bowl Quarterbacks Club'*

**PASADENA, Calif. (March 20, 2025)** The Pasadena Quarterbacks Club, entering its 80<sup>th</sup> year, will have new leadership beginning this fall. The Rose Bowl Stadium will take over the leadership, management, and facilitation of the organization, re-branded to the Rose Bowl Quarterbacks Club. The Pasadena Quarterbacks Club has annually been one of the most respected sporting clubs across America, with peer clubs regularly found in major college football markets across the nation.

The leadership of the Stadium, the Rose Bowl Legacy Foundation, and the Pasadena Quarterbacks Club have been engaged in discussions on how best to grow the club and the Board of Directors of the new Rose Bowl Quarterbacks Club, comprised of members of the former Pasadena Quarterbacks Club Board, is thrilled about the new partnership with the Rose Bowl Stadium.

It has contributed to local charitable and public causes and has always shined a weekly light on high school football within the San Gabriel Valley, including donations to support local high school programs.
