ROSE BOWL INSTITUTE CELEBRATES 7TH ANNUAL WOMEN'S EMPOWERMENT SYMPOSIUM

The three-day virtual event closes with record attendance and game-changing conversations.

PASADENA, Calif. (November 17, 2025) – The Rose Bowl Institute successfully concluded its 7th Annual Women's Empowerment Symposium, welcoming nearly 2,000 attendees from across the globe. As Abby Wambach and Julie Foudy shared during the panel, 'Sportsmanship is about more than how you win, it's about how you bring others up with you, lifting teammates and competitors alike and showing respect both on and off the field.' Additional speakers throughout the program included leaders in media, sports business, and education, each highlighting the expanding roles women are playing across industries.

The program concluded with a dynamic fireside chat featuring **Trishtan Williams**, Executive Film Producer and Director, and **Aerial Powers**, WNBA Champion in 2019 as a member of the Washington Mystics, Co-Owner of Team Liquid, and Athlete & Players Commission at Global Esports Federation. This conversation spotlighted the rise of the WNBA, the evolution of women's sports, and the importance of elevating and supporting female athletes at every level.

"For me, sportsmanship isn't just following the rules or smiling after a win, it's using what I learn from every rebound, every assist, every challenge to make a positive difference beyond basketball. I want that to be my legacy," said Aerial Powers.

Across the Symposium's three signature themes, Sportsmanship, Leadership, and Citizenship, participants explored how women are leading change, creating community, and paving pathways for the next generation. The event continues to serve as a cornerstone of the Institute's mission to educate, inspire, and empower individuals to pursue excellence with integrity.

About the Rose Bowl Stadium

The Rose Bowl Stadium is a National Historic Landmark built in 1922 and known throughout the world with its world-class reputation for hosting the 1932 Olympic Track Cycling event, five NFL Super Bowl Games, the 1984 Olympic Soccer matches, the 1994 Men's World Cup, the 1999 Women's World Cup, four BCS National College Football Championship Games, and the College Football Playoff Quarterfinal and the Semifinal Game. In 2028, the iconic venue will host the Olympic Games for a third time. The Rose Bowl is also known globally for hosting the annual Rose Bowl Game®, UCLA Football, international and Premier League soccer matches, and the World's Largest Flea Market.

The Rose Bowl Stadium is one of the world's greatest concert and festival venues, hosting world-class concerts including Coldplay, Karol G, the Rolling Stones, Taylor Swift, Beyonce and Jay-Z, and Kenny Chesney. Since 2016, Brookside Golf Course at the Rose Bowl has become a premier music festival venue hosting numerous annual events attracting hundreds of thousands of guests through the years.
